

The \$2 showcases 'Science Presents Steam and Electricity to Commerce and Manufacturing' with Robert Fulton & Samuel F. B. Morse on the back. Lastly, the \$5 depicts 'Electricity as the Dominant Force in the World' with Ulysses S. Grant and Philip Sheridan on the back. Many have considered these the most beautiful notes ever issued.
